A Brief Profile

Sonapur College, the nerve centre of higher studies in the entire Dimoria region of Kamrup(M), has paved its way to become one of the premier institutes of the state of Assam. Established in 1981, the college is situated in the serene ambience of a hillock. The college, apart from its regular courses, has also endeavoured to promote itself as a centre of multidisciplinary courses. Academic achievements have always been its priority. There is always a sincere effort in the part of the college to keep pace with the emerging trends of the contemporary world. A continuous pursuit of knowledge being its goal, the college has made considerable progress in the field of higher education thereby rewarding the expectations of the local people. An all-encompassing and comprehensive approach has proved to be highly beneficial to its students. Seminars, workshops, literary talks etc. are the regular features of its academic calendar. For Detained Students

H.S. Classes:

Unsuccessful candidates of H.S. Final Examination shall have to get their names enrolled as 'casual students.' The dates for the casual admission will be notified in due time. Without casual admission, no student will be allowed to fill up their form for the next final examination.

T.D.C. Classes:

Students who could not appear or have failed in any semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows:

- a) First Semester with the regular Third Semester examination.
 b) Second Semester with the regular Fourth Semester examination.
 c) Third semester with regular Fifth Semester examination.
 d) Fourth Semester with regular Sixth Semester examination.

A student may be allowed to "repeat" any one of the theory papers in the First, Second, Third and Fourth Semester, and may be allowed for "betterment" of marks in one paper in the Fifth Semester, provided the student secures less than 45% marks in that paper. No "repeat" / "betterment" shall be allowed in the practical examinations in any Semester.

A student must pass all his Semester examinations, including "repeat" and 'betterment' chances within five years from the date of admission to the First Semester course. A student will get a maximum of three chances to clear a particular Semester.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES
College Library



The college has a well stocked library managed by efficient library staff with a collection of over ten thousand textbooks and reference books. An effort is made to keep the library up to date by constantly upgrading the library list and adding new books in the fields of Commerce, Computer Science, Economics, Education, Geography, History, Literature, Mathematics, Philosophy, to the current collection. In addition to the above, the library also subscribes to a number of international and national journals, periodicals and many leading newspapers and magazines. To keep pace with the times the college authority has undertaken the task of computerization of the central library which ensures its convenient functioning.

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Every student is issued two library cards for one academic session. However students opting for major course are given two extra cards on additional payment of Rs. 50 after the declaration of the result of the major selection test. The library is governed by certain rules and instructions which are notified in the library notice board from time to time.

Book bank facility is offered to needy and deserving students in genuine need of this assistance. These students, on filling an additional form, are allowed to borrow books for the entire academic session and have to return the books only after the completion of the examination. The library also offers the facility of a 'Reserve Stack' where students can reserve a book of their choice in advance.

Moreover, in addition to the central library, all departments have their own departmental libraries which hugely benefit students of both major and general courses.

Student Welfare Fund

This fund aims to cater to the economically backward students by supplying them with essentials like textbooks, tuition fee, etc. Students seeking financial assistance are required to apply to the head of the institution and an income certificate of the parent/guardian has to be attached along with this application. Moreover, different departments also aid meritorious students by providing them with textbooks.

Students' Union

The Students' Union of Sonapur College consists of the general body of students and this union has to function under the guidance and control of the college authority. Its office bearers are elected annually. The election is conducted as per the direction of the Lyngdoh Commission. Students of the final year are not allowed to contest in the election. Its membership is compulsory for every student.

Scholarship and Incentives

A number of scholarships and incentives are available for the students of Sonapur College. On fulfilling the eligibility norms the students can avail the following scholarships:

- The student securing highest letter mark in the HS Final Geography Examination and the student securing highest among the first class holders of TDC Final Examination, Geography (Major) are awarded with a collection of books by Mr. Upen Borah, Founder Secretary of Sonapur College Governing Body.
- Nuru Mahanta Memorial Award is given to the highest letter mark holder in English in HS Final Examination by Mrs. Mridusmita Mahanta, Associate Professor, Department of English.
- Robin Choudhury Memorial Award, sponsored by the family, is awarded to the student securing highest marks in Assamese in the HS Final Examination.
- An award is also given to the student securing highest mark among the first class holders in Assamese Major by the department.
- Motiram Deka Memorial Award with a cash prize of Rs. 1000/-, sponsored by Dr. Dharna Ram Deka, Associate Professor, Department of Geography and Mrs. Doli Thakura, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, is awarded to the best group/individual of the Model and Chart Competition held during the college week.
- The best participant of the year in Annual College Week is awarded Dr. Dhanjit Medhi Memorial Trophy and a cash amount of Rs. 1000/- by Mrs. Khiroda Mali, Associate Professor, Department of Education.
- Arun Sankar Bhaduri Memorial Awards, sponsored by Sonapur Tea Estate, are given to the best player and winner of Boys' Marathon Race of the Annual Sports Week.
- The best girl player of the year in the Annual Sports is awarded a cash prize of Rs. 1000/- by Mr. Bipul Borah, Vice Principal of the college.
- The best singer of the year is awarded with a cash prize of Rs. 1111/- by Ms. Rashmirekha Saikia.
- The best social worker of the year is awarded a set of books by Mr. Rakhil Kalita, Social Worker, Sonapur.
- A collection of books is awarded to the student who collects the highest number of materials for the college museum.

Indoor Stadium

The construction of the college indoor stadium is on the verge of completion and the students from the coming academic year will get a scope to nurture their talents in the field of co-curricular activities along with academic ones.

Hostel Facility

At present the college has hostel facility for its girl students. The hostel can accommodate 20 students, where preference is given to ST (P) girls, and selection is done on merit basis. The hostel is situated adjacent to the college campus.

Information and Career Guidance Cell

Smart Classroom

The college has introduced the concept of the smart classroom to make the teaching-learning process more productive and to acquaint the students with the emerging trends in technology.

Girls' Common Room

The college has the facility of a girls' common room and it has a few equipments for indoor games, in addition to certain periodicals and magazines.

Boys' Common Room

Dekachang or Chamadi is a traditional concept of the Tiwa community of Assam. It serves as a recreational point for the youth. Dekachang is a dream-come-true project as the college has always endeavored to preserve the local culture and heritage and expose it to the world outside. In order to preserve this traditional concept, which is almost on the verge of extinction, the college has built the Dekachang and it serves as the boys' common room.

Travel Concession

Students are entitled to railway travel concession during vacations or during academic tours conducted by the college. They may contact the college office to avail this facility.

Group Insurance Scheme

The college provides its students the facility of Group Insurance Scheme (LIC) at a premium of Rs 20/- only per annum for a risk coverage of Rs 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only).

ACADEMIC AND CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Unit Test and Sessional Examinations

Unit tests and Sessional examinations will be held at regular intervals as notified in the academic calendar. Students who fail to appear in the same would be subjected to penalty which will be decided by the authority.

Seminar and Workshops

Departmental seminars and workshops are conducted at regular intervals to improve students' communicative skills as well as to impart knowledge in the concerned area. The respective topics and programmes are mentioned in the prospectus itself.

Dr. Dhanjit Medhi Memorial Lecture

This lecture is organized annually by the different departments in the fond memory of Late Dr. Dhanjit Medhi, founder principal of the college. For this lecture eminent personalities of the state are invited to acquaint the students with various contemporary issues.

Wall Magazine

Three regular issues of the college wall magazine Sopan namely Freshers' Social Issue, Saraswati Puja Issue and College Week Issue are released during the session. The other wall magazines Basundhara and Aishanu of Sonapur College Geographical Society and the departments of English and Economics respectively are also released at regular intervals.

Annual College Week

In order to encourage all-round development of the students, the college organizes the Annual College Week with the active initiation of the Students' Union. Students are encouraged to participate in sports and other co-curricular activities during this event.

**All Assam Inter College Debate Competition**

The college organizes a state-level inter college debate competition annually, the prize money for which is sponsored by the family of Sinam Iboton Singh in memory of Late Sinam Uriba Singh.

Rover and Ranger

The Sonapur College unit of Rover and Ranger Group is functioning with the active participation of the students. The students render social service both inside and outside the college campus.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

Sonapur College has a unit of N.C.C. The facilities of N.C.C. are provided to the students through the college unit.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

The college has an NSS unit which involves the students in various social service activities and awareness programmes.

Excursion

The college excursion is organized during the Puja vacation with the initiation of the students and teachers. The various departments also organize regular excursions for the academic benefit of the

Field Work

Field work is carried out by the students, along with a supervising teacher, on the concerned subject to gain a first hand experience of the problem to be studied.

Community Service

Students are encouraged to do community services at a regular basis and the college has an adopted village called Dikchak where various community services are done, including computer awareness programme.

FORUMS AND SOCIETIES

The students of the college can join a variety of societies and forums for their socio-economic and spiritual development along with the academic one. The students can avail the facilities rendered by the different forums and societies.

Sonapur College Geographical Society

The primary objective of this society is to make the subject of Geography popular among the students and public. It also aims at creating awareness in environmental preservation. The society also tries to find remedies through various projects on socio-economic and environmental problems of the locality. This society has organized a number of seminars and workshops, related to Geography and environment, in various schools.

Sonapur College Literary Society

The forum organizes seminars among students to pursue study and research in the literary field. It also aims at increasing students concern regarding the folk culture and tradition of the locality.

Sonapur College Economic Forum

Sonapur College Philosophical Forum

The forum organizes seminars, workshop and extension programmes at regular intervals to make students aware of the various trends and issues in Philosophy.

Sonapur College Museum

The museum preserves the antique resources scattered in Greater Dimoria. It attempts to make the students know the socio-cultural background and history of the locality. The students can also collect and contribute various items to the museum.

Dr. Dhanjit Medhi Foundation

The Dhanjit Medhi Foundation has been formed in memory of Late Dr. Dhanjit Medhi, the founder Principal of Sonapur College, for the promotion and patronage of all educational and literary activities, more specifically those pertaining to folk culture, folklore, etc. It aims to encourage the future generations in achieving their academic pursuits.

Blood Donors Association

The college has a voluntary Blood Donors Association where students, teachers and staff are members. The objective of the association is to yield service to the needy and deserving people.

STUDENTS' CODE OF CONDUCT

Attendance

Students are expected to be regular and punctual in their classes. A minimum of 75% attendance is mandatory for a student to be declared as regular and to be able to appear in Council and University exam. If a student has an attendance percentage below 75%, he/she shall be treated as non-collegiate. Moreover, a student failing to attend 60% of the total classes would be declared as dis-collegiate. In case a student does not attend classes for 25 days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes, he/she will forfeit his/her seat.

Discipline among Students

Students are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline in the college. They must abide by all rules and regulations of the college authority. Violation of any of the rules may make a student liable for disciplinary action. Any willful damage of college property would be treated as a serious offence and stern action will be taken in this regard.

College Uniform

It is mandatory for each and every student to wear the prescribed uniform in the college campus. A student breaking the uniform code would not be allowed enter the college premises. Wearing of uniform is also compulsory during examinations.



College Identity Card

A non-transferable identity card would be issued to each and every student. It is expected that every student carries this identity card at all times inside college premises and he/she must produce it whenever required. In case the card is lost or damaged, concerned authority must be informed immediately.

College Notice Board

Students are expected to read the college notice board regularly. Any notice that has to be circulated in the college through the notice board must be approved by college authority.

Ragging

Ragging in any form inside the college and hostel premises is strictly prohibited. Students indulging in ragging will be subjected to strong disciplinary action as per the directives of the Supreme Court/High Court.

Campus Cleanliness

Students are expected to keep the college campus clean at all costs. Spitting, writing, and sticking anything on the walls in the college campus will be treated as a punishable offence.

Energy Conservation

Each and every student must grow and practice the habit of switching off fans and lights when not in use.

Use of Mobile Phones

No student will be allowed to use mobile phone in the college campus. Disciplinary action would be taken against those violating this rule.

Tobacco Chewing

Smoking or chewing of tobacco and paan in any form is strictly prohibited inside the campus.

Silent Zone

During teaching hours all areas around classrooms shall be treated as silent zones. The authority can take action against students who create disturbance during college teaching hours.

SEMESTER SYSTEM OF GAUHATI UNIVERSITY

The Gauhati University introduces semester system in all undergraduate courses from the academic session 2011-2012 as per UGC's guideline. Accordingly, a TDC course consists of six semesters covering three calendar years. The schedule for the semester system is as follows:

- 1st, 3rd and 5th Semester (Including Exam) : June 1 - December 16
- 2nd, 4th and 6th Semester (Including Exam) : December 17- May 31,
- Semester Break : July 1- July 31

A student's performance will be monitored by the teachers throughout semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical works. Evaluation in each theory and practical paper will be as follows:

- Internal Evaluation : 20% Marks (Includes one sessional exam and one Group Discussion/Seminar/Home Assignment)
- External Evaluation : 80% Marks (Conducted by Gauhati University)

Internal evaluation shall be based on sessional examinations, home assignments, seminars, library works in each semester, while External Evaluation shall be through a final examination at the end of the semester. The pass marks on each theory paper is 30% and each practical paper is 40%. Students must secure pass mark in both internal and external evaluation test separately.


