The enchanting scenic beauty and the unique culture of the various tribes inhabiting the locality have added to a congenial academic atmosphere in the college. Societal responsibilities have always been considered a priority so as to be able to lead by example for its students. In addition to Higher Secondary in Arts and Commerce, a total of 13 (thirteen) departments offer bachelor programmes in both Arts and Commerce. To cater to the needs of the students intending to study vocational courses, the college offers B.Voc programmes in Retail Management & IT, Travel & Tourism Management, and Theatre & Stage-craft under the Deen Dayal Upadhyay Centre for Knowledge Acquisition and Up-gradation of Skilled Human Abilities and Livelihood (DDU KAUSHAL). The college is also running a study centre of Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU) and is offering Graduate and post-graduate courses. The post-graduate courses in Assamese, English and Geography have enhanced the efficacy of the institute.

The college has an enrolment of more than 1700 students, most of them belonging to economically background classes. In addition to NAAC accreditation, the college has also been regularly participating in National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) and India Today's "The Best College of India" survey. NIRF has ranked Sonapur College at the Rank Band: 101 to 150 (the only college in Assam at this rank band) at National Level in 2018. On the other hand, India Today ranked the college at 137 position among Arts colleges in the country in 2023.

There are facilities like multi-gym, indoor stadium etc. to cater to the physical needs of the students. The students can also participate in the nation building activities through enrolment into 50 Assam NCC Air wings, 1st NCC Assam Btln, and NSS. Since the college aims at the holistic growth of its students, a number of co-curricular activities find space in the annual calendar of the college. The approach for building the democratic consciousness among the students is made through the Student Union's Election every year with a non-political slant. Students also have access to different literary and non-literary platforms to showcase their flairs in specific fields. Among a number of publications, the college also provides a platform to the students to publish their research articles in Budding Scholar, a student's journal published annually. The college, in tune with the NEP 2020, has put lots of emphasis in building an entrepreneurial ecosystem in the college through various programmes. The college has an Incubation Centre through which students can embark on an Entrepreneurial and Start-up journey.



Eligibility

- ▶ A student can choose subjects from the pool of subjects created as per the GUFYUGP.
- ▶ A student must secure minimum 45% marks in the concerned subject that she/he opts for Major.





Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)


The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) of Gauhati University is as per UGC's Curricular Framework, published in November 2022.

Duration: The NEP's FYUGP, it is a 4-year degree programme.

Exits & Entries : In the FYUGP, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice – after one year, after two years, and after three years. If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exits after three years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree. And finally if a student completes the whole 4-year, one gets a Bachelor's Degree (Honours).

Progression

If a student exits the FYUGP after 3 years, s/he will need to take admission into the first year of a Master's programme, which is a 2-year degree programme. However, if a student fully completes an FYUGP, s/he needs to take admission into the second year of a Master's programme and needs to complete only one year to get a Master's Degree. Under CBCS, there was no such pathways.



Core Courses

- The Core Courses have to be chosen from among a plethora of subjects offered. In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a stream, the components of the Core Courses are Major and/or Minors, while in case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline, there are no majors and minors.
- In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, a student either chooses a Major and Minors or just Minors from among the subjects. In any case, a student needs to complete 21 courses or 84 credits by the third year.
- For a majority of students, the Core Course will consist of one Major and two Minors.

Common Courses

The Common Courses are to be studied by all students alike and altogether they carry a total credit of 36 over a three year period. These Courses are further divided in five sub-categories:

• Multi-disciplinary courses:

These are 3 - credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects –

Group A - Natural Science

Group D - Humanities & Social Science

Group B - Mathematical Science

Group E - Media & Information

Group C - Commerce

A student CANNOT choose a multidisciplinary subject, if s/he has already studied that subject during Class XI-XII. Also the subject of these courses MUST not be among the Core Subjects the student has already chosen.

• Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) :

This is an 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication). Each student needs to complete two papers of 4-credits each – one from English Usage and other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. Both these courses are further divided into two 2-credit courses each. The English Communication course is to be completed during Semesters 1-2 and the MIL course is to be completed during Semesters 5-6.

• Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. All students need to complete three skill courses, each with 3 credits during Semesters 1-3.

• Value Added Courses (VAC):

The VAC courses will come from four sub groups – (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6. Each student will have to take any three courses, each of 2-credit, from any three groups during Semesters 1, 2, & 4. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.

• Internship

All students are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out in any semester during Semesters 3-6. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.

For Detained Students

H.S. Classes:

Unsuccessful candidates of H.S. Final Examination shall have to get their names enrolled as 'casual students.' The dates for the casual admission will be notified in due time. Without casual admission, no student will be allowed to fill up their form for the next final examination

Students' Code of Conduct

Attendance

Regular attendance in all the classes is mandatory for the Students. Students having a minimum of 75% are declared as regular and are allowed to appear in Council and University exam. If a student has an attendance percentage below 75%, he/she shall be treated as non-collegiate. Moreover, a student failing to attend 60% of the total classes would be declared as dis-collegiate. If a student fails to attend classes for 25 days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes, he/she will forfeit his/her seat.

Discipline among Students

Students are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline in the college campus. The college authority lays down certain rules and regulations, violation of which may make a student liable for disciplinary action. Any willful damage of college property would be treated as a serious offence and stern action will be taken in this regard.

College Uniform

Wearing of prescribed uniform in the college campus is **mandatory for each and every student**. A student breaking the uniform code would not be allowed to enter the college premises. It is also compulsory for each and every student to wear uniform during examinations.

College Identity Card

Each and every student of the college is issued a non-transferable identity card and it is expected that she/he carries it at all times inside the college premises. In case the card is lost or damaged, concerned authority must be informed immediately.

College Notice Board

Students are expected to grow the habit of reading the college notice boards regularly. Any notice that has to be circulated in the college through the notice boards must be approved by the college authority.

Ragging

Ragging in any form inside the college and hostel premises is strictly prohibited. Students indulging in ragging will be subjected to strong disciplinary action as per the directives of the Supreme Court/High Court.

Campus Cleanliness

It is considered to be the duty of each and every student to keep the college campus clean at all costs. Spitting, writing, and sticking anything on the walls in the college campus will be treated as a punishable offence.

Energy Conservation

In order to conserve energy, each and every student is expected to grow and practice the habit of switching off fans and lights when not in use.

Use of Mobile Phones

Use of mobile phone in the college campus is **strictly prohibited**. Students violating this rule would invite disciplinary action from the concerned authority.

Tobacco Chewing

Smoking or chewing of tobacco and paan in any form is strictly prohibited inside the campus.

During teaching hours all areas around classrooms shall be treated as silent zones. The authority can take action against students who create disturbance during college teaching hours.

Restroom for persons with disability

Information and Career Guidance Cell


