  - e. **Training of students:** The Department of Geography will train its students to prepare Model and Chart after a survey work.

- f. **Seminar/Workshop to be conducted:** Departmental seminars will be conducted by the departments as per schedule mentioned in the Prospectus cum Academic Calendar.
- g. **Classes in feeder schools:** The Department of English will conduct classes in the feeder schools with a spirit to enhance the quality of the students.
- h. **Inter class presentation:** At the end of the session, the departments will encourage students to prepare seminar papers and present the same in the class.

### 3. **Community Development Programme :**

- a. Awareness Programmes to be organized in different schools.
- b. Extension lectures to be organized in the feeder schools to raise the standard of the input that will further help in lowering the drop-outs in the college.

### 4. **Infrastructure Development:**

- a. Extension of the Campus field
- b. Purchase of Library books
- c. Purchase of sports items
- d. To complete the ground floor of the newly constructed building.
- e. To whitewash and repair the classroom and laboratories.
- f. To approach different Government agencies for allocation of fund for infrastructure development.

## **OUT COME ACHIEVED**

- a. Environmental Studies as a core subject for TDC 2<sup>nd</sup> year has been introduced. A cell has been constituted with Mr. Dharma Ram Deka, Senior Lecturer, Department of Geography as the Coordinator.
- b. B. Com 2<sup>nd</sup> year classes started officially. New teachers were recruited to cater to the needs of the students.
- c. The Departments had framed the remedial course to meet the demand of the students and accordingly the faculty members took the classes.
- d. The Departments took tutorial classes as per the class routine. Some departments even took extra classes for the benefit of the students.
- e. As per the departmental plan submitted before the commencement of the session, the Department of Economics conducted a field survey on Sonapur vegetable Market and accordingly a project was done where the students as well as the faculty members took an active part.
- f. The Department of Geography conducted a survey on 'Weekly Market of Sonapur' and based on the findings the students were trained to prepare Model & Charts and the same was displayed in an exhibition on the occasion of College Week.
- g. The Department of Geography conducted a project on 'Production and Distribution Mechanism of Hindustan Paper Corporation, Jagiroad. After generating the data, the Department prepared the project report.
- h. In order to popularize RASHTRA BHASA among the students and the faculty, the department of Hindi celebrated the Hindi Divas on 13<sup>th</sup> September where the students and faculty members of the college participated actively. Different competitions were also organized in this connection. Mr. Sushil Azad, PGT of KV Digaru and a noted literature graced the occasion as Guest of Honour.
- i. Like the previous years, this year also a number of departments of the college conducted extension Programmes in the feeder schools. As a part of this extension programme the Departments of English, Education and Geography took the initiative for free tutorial classes for H.S.L.C./ H.S. students in the feeder schools.
- j. As per the departmental schedule mentioned in the Prospectus and Academic Calendar of the year, the departments organized seminars and workshops for which experts were invited for deliberation. The students interacted actively and all the sessions proved to be beneficial and enlightening for the students of the departments as well as college in general.

- k. For the benefit of the students, a number of departments of the college conducted 'Inter-class Presentation Sessions' from time to time where students participated and presented papers under the guidance of departmental teachers.
- l. As a part of continuous evaluation, the college conducted two unit tests and one selection test for all the classes and students.
- m. The college has always encouraged the faculties to go for research. Four teachers got themselves registered for Ph.D. Programme at different universities.
- n. As an institute of higher education, Sonapur College has always tried to influence the students of the feeder schools in the locality by imparting lectures on various topics.
- o. A cleanliness drive was conducted by the Students Union of the college at Dikchak village. The village folks of Dikchak also participated in the drive. Similar programme was also organized in the college campus.
- p. The campus field was expanded with a view to initiate more infrastructure development Programmes as well as to provide students with better facilities for co-curricular activities.
- q. To increase the number of books as per the demand of the students and the requirement submitted by the teachers, the college authority purchased a good number of books in the session.
- r. To meet the demands of the students and to provide better facilities, the college purchased a number of sports items.
- s. A portion of the ground floor of the RCC Building was completed.
- t. The theatre group 'Alakananda Theatre' was invited to generate fund which is of utmost importance to run the Commerce Stream of the college. A sum of Rupees 57,000/- was added to the college fund from this mobile theatrical show.
- u. For the purpose of beautification and conservation of nature, plantation drive was organized during the session with the help extended by the Department of Forest, Government of Assam.

- a. Sonapur College, a premier institution of higher education in Dimoria area cherishes its mission to spread knowledge among the students of this locality.

The group of students staged a performance of the play '*Amarattar Xapun*' which was written and directed by Mr. Bhuyan.
- e. As a part of initiating the students to gain exposure and comprehend the functioning of Industries, the college sent 10 (ten) students to visit different industries of Assam under the '*UDYOG JYOTI ACHANI*', conducted by the Directorate of Industries and Commerce, Udyog Bhawan, Assam.
- f. The college organized an awareness programme at Dikchak where Mrs. Dipa Kakoti, HOD of Education deliberated on 'Need of Education for Women Empowerment'.
- g. An awareness camp on 'Self Employment and Entrepreneurship, was organized in the college premises in collaboration with Assam Institute of Management on 15<sup>th</sup> Sep 2006.

## **2. NEW ACADEMIC PROGRAMME INITIATED:-**

- a. The 2<sup>nd</sup> year commerce classes started from the session.
- b. The students of TDC 2<sup>nd</sup> year class were taken for a field trip and were made to present a project report on the same.
- c. The various departments of the college had been conducting tutorial classes.
- d. As the input from the feeder schools are very poor, the college has initiated its various extension services for the upliftment of the students of the feeder schools. The department of English organized a series of classes in Snakardev Sishu Vidya Niketan, Sonapur.
- e. The department of Geography organized a series of programmes of Environment awareness as part of National Environment Awareness Campaign, 2006.

### **3. INNOVATION IN CURRICULAR DESIGN AND TRANSACTION:-**

- The curriculum is designed by Gauhati University.
- The various departments undertook various innovative measures to familiarize the students with the new course. The students were made to comprehend the new curricula like seminar paper presentation, group discussion, audio-video means and so on.

- As per the guidelines of the Gauhati University, Environmental Science was introduced in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year degree classes, which has been treated as an interdisciplinary subject in the college. The faculty members of all departments were allotted their own course to teach the students.
- In commerce stream, the different departments like English, Assamese, Economics, and Information Technology took up classes to transact the curriculum in the respective fields.

- c. The college has published three issues of each of the four wall magazines of our college. The students are provided a chance to



- expose their talents in creative writing as well as in making models, chart and painting.
- d. The college arranged cleanliness drive in the college campus as well as in the market area where the students, teachers and office staff took active part.
  - e. The students were taken to field trips, excursion to make them aware of their surroundings, their obligations and duties towards society and also to imbibe in them a feeling of co-operation and brotherhood.
  - f. The college organized a field study on Environmental Awareness where the students were encouraged to gather first hand knowledge regarding environmental problems, hazards, protection, measures etc., by directly communicating with the neighborhood industries as well as people residing in those areas. Later they submitted a field study report to the teachers.
