As per the demand of the syllabus and the need of the students, there prevails a strong Internal Evaluation system in the college in accordance to the three available streams of the college. Students are assessed for their performance in the presentation as well as their preparation of the seminar papers. In case of the students in Vocational streams, the internal assessment is primarily made from field activities. Paper presentations and group discussions have been initiated in the Commerce stream though it is not a part of their curriculum. Internal evaluation has great influence on the overall result of the final examinations.
