

Eligibility for Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)

- A student must secure minimum 45% marks in the concerned subject that she/he opts for Major.




Figure 3.1: Core Courses options — Option for a Major and two Minors.




Figure 3.2: Core Courses options — Option with only Minors.





Four Years Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)

The FYUGP of Gauhati University is as per the UGC's curricular framework, published in November 2022.

- Duration: The FYUGP is a 4 year degree programme.
- Exits and Entries: In the FYUGP, one has to choice to exit from the programme thrice, i.e. after 1 years, 2 years and 3 years. If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. On exit after 2 years, one gets a diploma and if one exits after 3 years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree. Finally, if a student completes a whole 4 years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree with Honours.



Core Courses

- The Core Courses have to be chosen from among a plethora of subjects offered. In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a stream, the components of the Core Courses are Major and/or Minors, while in case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline, there are no majors and minors.
- In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, a student either chooses a Major and Minors or just Minors from among the subjects. In any case, a student needs to complete 21 courses or 84 credits by the third year.
- For a majority of students, the Core Course will consist of one Major and two Minors.

Common Courses

The Common Courses are to be studied by all students alike and altogether they carry a total credit of 36 over a three year period. These Courses are further divided in five sub-categories:

• Multi-disciplinary courses:

These are 3 - credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects –

Group A - Natural Science

Group D - Humanites & Social Science

Group B - Mathematical Science

Group E - Media & Information

Group C - Commerce

A student CANNOT choose a multidisciplinary subject, if s/he has already studied that subject during Class XI-XII. Also the subject of these courses MUST not be among the Core Subjects the student has already chosen.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) :

This is an 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication). Each student needs to complete two papers of 4-credits each — one from English Usage and other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. Both these courses are further divided into two 2-credit courses each. The English Communication course is to be completed during Semesters 1-2 and the MIL course is to be completed during Semesters 5-6.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. All students need to complete three skill courses, each with 3 credits during Semesters 1-3.

Value Added Courses (VAC):

The VAC courses will come from four sub groups — (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6. Each student will have to take any three courses, each of 2-credit, from any three groups during Semesters 1, 2, & 4. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.

• Internship:

All student are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out in any semester during Semesters 3-6. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.

IMPORTANT NOTE: It is compulsory for all students to provide the contact number of their parents/guardian at the time of admission along with theire mail id. Contact numbers of the students must remain the same till the declaration of 6th semester result otherwise online information and process from GU may get disrupted.

Students' Code of Conduct

Attendance

Regular attendance in all the classes is mandatory for the Students. Students having a minimum of 75% are declared as regular and are allowed to appear in Council and University exam. If a student has an attendance percentage below 75%, he/she shall be treated as non-collegiate. Moreover, a student failing to attend 60% of the total classes would be declared as dis-collegiate. If a student fails to attend classes for 25 days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes, he/she will forfeit his/her seat.

Discipline among Students

Students are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline in the college campus. The college authority lays down certain rules and regulations, violation of which may make a student liable for disciplinary action. Any willful damage of college property would be treated as a serious offence and stern action will be taken in this regard.

College Uniform

Wearing of prescribed uniform in the college campus is **mandatory for each and every student**. A student breaking the uniform code would not be allowed to enter the college premises. It is also compulsory for each and every student to wear uniform during examinations.

College Identity Card

Each and every student of the college is issued a non-transferable identity card and it is expected that she/he carries it at all times inside the college premises. In case the card is lost or damaged, concerned authority must be informed immediately.

College Notice Board

Students are expected to grow the habit of reading the college notice boards regularly. Any notice that has to be circulated in the college through the notice boards must be approved by the college authority.

Ragging

Ragging in any form inside the college and hostel premises is strictly prohibited. Students indulging in ragging will be subjected to strong disciplinary action as per the directives of the Supreme Court/High Court.

Campus Cleanliness

It is considered to be the duty of each and every student to keep the college campus clean at all costs. Spitting, writing, and sticking anything on the walls in the college campus will be treated as a punishable offence.

Energy Conservation

In order to conserve energy, each and every student is expected to grow and practice the habit of switching off fans and lights when not in use.

Use of Mobile Phones

Use of mobile phone in the college campus is **strictly prohibited**. Students violating this rule would invite disciplinary action from the concerned authority.

Tobacco Chewing

Smoking or chewing of tobacco and paan in any form is strictly prohibited inside the campus.

Silent Zone

During teaching hours all areas around classrooms shall be treated as silent zones. The authority can take action against students who create disturbance during college teaching hours.

Use of Library

Students are expected to maintain discipline in the library and be careful in handling.

It is compulsory for all students with two Wheelers to submit the copies of their Driving License and Registration Card to the college authority failing which they will not be permitted to avail the parking facility within the college premises.

- Each student is issued two library cards for one academic session.
- Every year new collection of books in addition to references are maintained by the committed library staff in the fields of Commerce, Computer Science, Economics, Education, Geography, History, Literature, Mathematics, Philosophy, Theatre & Stage Craft, Tourism & Travel Management and Retail Management & IT.

- Digitization of books, previous years' question papers immensely benefits every student.
- By making an additional payment of Rs 50 enables students of major courses to obtain two extra cards after the declaration of the result of the major selection test. The library is governed by certain rules and instructions which are notified in the library notice board from time to time.
- Book bank facility is an additional feature whereby, on filling an additional form, needy and deserving
- students are allowed to borrow books till the end of their academic session. Apart from the central library, different departments of the college also have their own departmental library which hugely benefits the students of the major courses.
- The Library has also implemented the initiatives of Ministry of Education, Govt. of India by forming the NDLI club amoung the students & faculties of the college.

Group Insurance Scheme [LICI]

This facility is provided to the students of the college by the authority at a premium of Rs 30/- only per annum for a risk coverage of Rs 10,000/-(Rupees Ten Thousand only).

Girls' Common Room

The College is equipped with a Girls' Common Room which has indoor game facilities, periodicals and magazines. It has been renovated to accommodate more students and provide better facilities.



Academic And Co-Curricular Activities

Unit Test and Sessional Examinations

Unit tests and sessional examinations will be held at regular intervals as notified in the academic calendar. Students who fail to appear in the same would be subjected to penalty which will be decided by the authority and the authority may not allow them to fill up form for examination.

Remedial classes

The departments of the college have provisions of remedial and tutorial classes for the needy students based on their performance in unit tests and sessional examinations.

Seminar and Workshops

Student centric seminars and workshops are organised on a regular basis for the benefit of students, to improve students' communication skills as well as to impart knowledge in the concerned area. The college also organises national seminars and workshops sponsored by UGC and other agencies at regular intervals The respective topics and programmes for the students by the departments are mentioned in the prospectus itself.

Wall Magazine

A number of wall magazines have been introduced in course of time by the college and its various departments in an effort to inculcate the habit of writing in the students. The wall magazines are issued twice in an academic year.



Annual College Week

The Annual College Week is organised every year by the college with the active initiation of the Students' Union, in order to encourage all-round development of the students. Students are encouraged to participate in sports and other co-curricular activities during this event.

Dr. Dhanjit Medhi Memorial Lecture

A memorial lecture in fond memory of Late Dr. Dhanjit Medhi, Founder Principal of the college, is organised by the college in its premises every year. For this lecture, eminent personalities of the state are invited to interact with the students regarding various contemporary issues.



National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The NCC Unit of the college has been active since the day of its inception. The students enrolled are actively involved in various camps and programmes organised in different parts of the country. The facilities of NCC are provided to the students through the unit of the college.


